## Shuttle Services

Sustainable Transportation Initiatives

### Definitions & Importance

Inter-campus shuttle services enable faculty, staff, students, patients, and visitors to move efficiently and safely between campus locations without using their private vehicles. Combined with rideshare, bicycling, pedestrian and public transit programs, shuttle service helps mitigate the impacts associated with the use of single occupancy vehicles.

The UCSF Shuttle program is designed to facilitate work-related travel between UCSF offices and reduce single-occupancy intra-campus trips during the day, and is not designed or intended to be used as commuter transportation. The shuttle operates Monday through Friday (excluding holidays) throughout the year and runs according to published schedules.

### Baseline:

The campus shuttle system currently transports 2.0 million passengers annually with a fleet of 53 shuttles, 71 shuttle drivers, 125 shifts, and 15 routes.

### Accomplishments:

- ★ Secure grant funding for two CNG shuttles serving the Mission Bay area.
- ★ Secure grant funding for bike racks on shuttles
- ★ 100% ridership growth since June 2003
- ★ Use full-size buses between Mission Bay and Parnassus to serve Mission Bay campus housing

**Goals #1:** Increase ridership by 5% over the next 12 months as demand increases in the Mission Bay and China Basin areas.

**Goals #2** Reconfigure shuttle route to accommodate additional UCSF locations, reduce need for transfer points between main campus sites, and reduce commute time between major campus sites.

**Goal #3:** Apply for Clean Air Champions Award through BAAQMD honoring our commitment to improving air quality by adopting less polluting lifestyles.
