

UCSF TRANSPORTATION FACT SHEET

2020 Commute Mode Split

- Single Occupancy Vehicle 24.6%
- Sustainable Transportation 75.4%

Transportation Fleet

- 80 buses serving 10 routes
- Shuttle network serves all major campuses: Parnassus Heights, Mission Bay, Mount Zion, Laurel Heights, MCB and ZSFG
- 19% of buses are all-electric
- 100% of TS fleet (excluding buses) are electric or hybrid

Parking

- 8,800+ parking spaces for employee pass and patient/visitor public parking
- Daily Parking Rates:
 - Hourly: \$5
 - Daily Max: \$35
 - Patient/Visitor with ADA placard: \$7
 - Motorcycle: \$5
- Over 100 EV stations
- “Green” preferred parking spaces for public and permit holders who drive fuel-efficient vehicles

Bicycling

- 2,300+ active bike registrants
- 1,400+ bike parking spaces available
- Free access to bike cages at Parnassus Heights, Mission Bay Campus, Mount Zion, and ZSFG with ID proximity card access
- Bike repair stands available at Parnassus Heights, Mission Bay, Dogpatch, and ZSFG
- Bike shower program through Fitness & Recreation Centers
- Bike racks on all shuttles
- Bay Wheels bike stations at Mission Bay, Dogpatch, Mount Zion, China Basin, MCB, and ZSFG

Commute Planner

- [MyCommute.ucsf.edu](https://mycommute.ucsf.edu): sustainable transit options customized by starting location and destination – carpool, vanpool, public transit, biking and more

Vanpool & Carpool

- Vanpool program (Commute with Enterprise) includes 11 daily vanpools with 50 participants
- 70+ reserved carpool stalls at various campus sites

Vehicle Sharing

- Zipcar available at Parnassus Heights, Mission Bay, Mount Zion, Laurel Heights, MCB, and Dogpatch with 13 vehicles available, 39% usage
- 760 UCSF Zipcar members

Pre-Tax Commuter Benefits

- 4,700 employees participate in the pre-tax commuter benefits program
- Employees may save up to \$500 per year
- Using pre-tax commuter benefits may save participants up to 40% on hourly and daily parking fees

Emergency Ride Home Program

- \$50 reimbursement for emergency transportation home for employees who commute to UCSF sustainably
